Read the paragraphs below. Look for words with the suffixes -ate and -ary.


Zoologist Dian Fossey made an intricate study of gorillas in Rwanda for about 15 years. These primates can enthrall anybody, but for Dian, they became her primary focus in life.

In 1967, Dian started a research center so she could study these creatures she was so passionate about. She lived so close to them that they came to trust her. The first time a gorilla made voluntary contact with a human was when one touched Dian's hand. It became customary for her to sit with them all day. In a way she became an honorary gorilla.

The center was almost a sanctuary for the gorillas. It helped to protect them from poachers who wanted to kill them. Poachers killed gorillas to eat them or to sell their fur. They also would kill whole families just to capture babies to sell to a zoo.

In 1977, poachers killed Dian's favorite gorilla. This made her determined to pass laws that would protect the gorillas. But poachers were not the type to follow laws. So Dian started setting up patrols to keep the poachers away. This is how she became a threat to the poachers.

It may have been her attempts to frustrate the poachers that led to her death in 1985. No one is sure who ended the life of this emissary to the gorillas.
