Social Studies Word Hunt

Dolores Huerta grew up around farm workers. She saw how hard they worked and yet how difficult their lives were. Dolores dreamed of better times, but her thoughts were not just imaginary ramblings. Huerta grew up and did something. She convinced farm workers to stand together and fight for better working conditions and better wages. She organized national boycotts of grapes and other farm products. The result was more satisfactory contracts for the workers. This improved life for the workers, which was always Huerta's primary goal.

The fight was not always easy. The farm owners and the police saw Huerta's speeches as inflammatory and her cause as revolutionary. The police arrested her more than twenty times. During one march, the police struck her with a baton and injured her. She lost a lot of blood, and had to have surgery to repair her broken ribs. After she recovered, she sued the San Francisco police department. She won her case, and the police had to change the way they handled protesters. Huerta also received a compensatory judgment. She gave this monetary award to the cause.

Over the years, Huerta has received many honorary awards, including induction into the National Women's Hall of Fame. Now in her 80s, she is still giving speeches and teaching classes. The Dolores Huerta Foundation seeks out and mentors new community leaders. This new generation will continue the fight for better health care, housing, education, and jobs. Dolores Huerta is an ordinary woman who continues to accomplish extraordinary things.
