Science Word Hunt

Read the passage below and look for words that contain the suffixes -ant, -ent, -ance, and -ence.

Red wolves were once prevalent throughout the southeastern United States. As more people took up residence in the wolves' habitat, the wolves were pushed out. By 1987, red wolves were declared extinct in the wild. The only red wolves still alive were in zoos or other wildlife park areas. Biologists knew they had to do something to restore the wolf population. They came up with a plan to breed the wolves in captivity and then release them into the wild. They hoped the released wolves would continue breeding.

When the first captive born wolves were ready to be released, biologists had a hard time finding a place to put them. Many people had negative ideas about wolves. Residents in family neighborhoods were afraid of them. Farmers thought they would kill their livestock. Finally, a permanent home was found. Alligator River National Wildlife Reserve in North Carolina was the perfect home for red wolves. It had an abundance of prey animals for the wolves to hunt. It was surrounded by water on three sides, making it inconvenient for wolves to wander off. Restoration began with four pairs of red wolves released in 1987.

Biologists didn't expect all the wolves to survive, but they were confident that some would. In the spring of 1988, the first wild pups were born. Biologists were jubilant. This was significant evidence that predators bred in captivity could thrive in the wild. More wolves were released later that year.

Today 100–120 red wolves call northeastern North Carolina home. This is the world's only wild population of red wolves.
